

LOMA ESTATES AZ0413110 DRINKING WATER ADVISORY

Cactus State Utility Operating Company (Cactus State) is publishing this notice to inform customers about the detection of a Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substance (PFAS) **below** the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for PFAS in drinking water at the Loma Estates water system (AZ0413110).

In April 2024, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) finalized a National Primary Drinking Water Regulation establishing MCLs for six types of PFAS in drinking water: PFOA, PFOS, PFHxS, PFNA, and HFPO-DA as contaminants with individual MCLs, and PFAS mixtures containing at least two or more of PFHxS, PFNA, HFPO-DA, and PFBS using a Hazard Index MCL to account for the combined and co-occurring levels of these PFAS in drinking water. While Arizona has no known manufacturers of PFAS chemicals, PFAS has been used in a variety of everyday products and product coatings since the early 1950s. Research indicates PFAS compounds were not used on large-scale industrial applications and tend to be localized near areas of potential frequent use.

On March 18, 2026, as part of the PFAS initial monitoring requirements, Cactus State conducted a test of the Loma Estates AZ0413110 water system. The laboratory reported a detection of PFOA and PFHxS slightly above laboratory detection limit, while still **below** the EPA MCL. PFBS was also detected at a concentration slightly above laboratory detection limit; however, EPA has not established a MCL for this constituent.
